- It is thought that The Stone Age began about 2 million years ago – 2,000,000.
- In Britain, the Stone Age began around 17,000 years ago.
- Modern human, known as Homo sapiens, developed around 200,000 years ago.
- The Stone Age is the name given to the earliest period of human culture when stone tools were first used.
- In the Stone Age people moved frequently following the animals that they hunted and gathering fruits and berries when they could.
- Skara Brae is a Stone Age village discovered in 1850 by William Watts on the islands of Orkney, Scotland.

### VOCABULARY

<b>Century</b>	One hundred years.
<b>Archaeologist</b>	Archeologists study the remains people have left behind to discover how they lived.
<b>Hunter gatherer</b>	A person who lives chiefly by hunting, fishing and harvesting wild food.
<b>Stone Age</b>	The earliest period of human culture when stone tools were first used.
<b>Bronze Age</b>	A prehistoric period when weapons and tools were made of bronze rather than stone.
<b>Iron Age</b>	A prehistoric period when weapons and tools came to be made of iron.
<b>Flint</b>	Flint was commonly used for making stone tools.
<b>Skara Brae</b>	A Stone Age Orkney village.
<b>Ancient</b>	Having lived or existed for a very long time.

- Artefacts discovered in Skara Brae include 8 houses, jewellery and stone tools.
