

We will be writing: Non Chronological report & narrative.



Year 3 Spring Term Two Overview

This term we are continuing to focus on Science. We now turn our attention to the wonderful world of Plants. In English, we will be writing non-chronological report as we journey on into Charlotte's Web. In Maths, we will be learning to calculate multiplication and division problems and develop our knowledge of money.

Mathematics
